Entering and leaving aviaries and cages. Possibility of trapping fingers or banging heads.	Coaches and Participants	Low	Safety talk and constant supervision. First aid kit to be available at all times.	Get the participants to take their time, and no messing about
Use of hoses and cleaning equipment in the cleaning of the cages. (Tripping over the hose, getting fingers trapped.) Rakes. Dirty hands.	Coaches and participants	Low	Safety talk and constant supervision. First aid kit to be available at all times. Appropriate clothing. (Rubber gloves, hats, tops, bottoms.) <i>Aviary doors to be always shut behind at all times.</i>	Get the participants to take their time, and no messing about. When finished with hose, reel it in, do not leave lying on ground. Leave rake off ground or standing straight in the corner when not using it, and put straight away when finished with it. Wash hands when finished especially before eating.
<i>Pond. (Deep Water Risk of Drowning.)</i>	Coaches and participants	Medium	Safety talk and constant supervision. There are safety rails on two sides of the pond, and big bushes and rocks on the third side. On the fourth side there are only a few rocks making this the only properly accessible side to the pond, although this is still probably enough to deter anyone from getting too close to the edge of the pond. There is a "BEWARE SLIPPERY PATHS SIGN" by the main viewing side of the pond. Essentials box containing safety throw ropes will be present.	Get the participants to take their time, and no messing about. Make sure coaches and participants have gripped boots on rainy or snowy days.
